Jesus does not condone injustice. But in today's gospel, in which he refuses to arbitrate a property dispute between two brothers, he questions the values on which most humans base their lives. He challenges the complainant to realize that material possessions are a real danger to the life of the spirit. The rich fool of Jesus' parable overlooked the truth that life in God's grace is infinitely more important than possessing everything which belongs to us in justice. Jesus makes one demand: that we live in love. The first reading is a disconcerting reminder that success, even when honestly earned through hard work, is deceptive if we make it an end in itself. We will discover that life is ashes if our objective is security rather than the dependence of the spiritually poor on God. Heaven is the goal of Christians; through baptism we died to sin in order to rise to a transformed life, hidden with Christ in God, and united by him with all people. In this redeemed world there will be no more discrimination, distinctions or preferment, for we will all be one in Christ.

19th SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME - C

Those who trust in God and not in themselves, and who share their possessions, are promised the kingdom as God's free gift. But they must be responsible servants. Christ's return from the wedding celebration of heaven will be as unexpected as a burglar's break-in. If his servants are ready and waiting, their master will do an astonishing thing: become their servant. But those given special responsibility while the Lord's return is delayed will be held especially accountable, and irresponsible servants will be treated like the faithless. No position in the kingdom preserves one from this accounting. All of us are servants, each with different tasks. Our concern is to discharge our own duties, not lording it over others. God demands much of those who have been given the kingdom! The Wisdom reading, a meditation on Passover, hymns the chosen people's long-awaited deliverance from slavery and invites us as a people to trust in God's return. Hebrews recalls the faith of our forebears, who believed although they died before seeing God's promise fulfilled. This is the faith we must have as we wait in hope for Christ's coming.



Great News! ... our refugee family is arriving

A Project of Hope

We have been informed that our refugee family has been told to prepare as they should be leaving Turkey, if all goes well, on Wednesday September 11! We are now awaiting confirmation from the Canadian Government. When the family arrives in Canada they will stay in temporary housing for about two to three weeks. During that time, we will help to settle them in Toronto. They will need apply for OHIP, Social Insurance, register the children in school and many other things. Members of the three parishes committee will be helping with these things. We will keep you informed as the situation progresses, but please continue to pray for the family's smooth and successful transition to Canada.
