Every year Christmas unites the weary and warring human family for a few days of rejoicing. Each year we are surprised anew at the richness of God's gift to us of Christ. From contemplating this gift we learn the meaning of self-giving love. Today's Mass centers on our human school of love, the family. Sirach comments on the fourth commandment to honor one's parents. The last verse of Colossians draw on a pre-Christian household code, but its first two sections are remarkable within a patriarchal culture for their fully Christian values: relationships are based on mutual love and forgiveness rather than subordination. With such love God sent his Son. The gospel reading remind us that the Holy Family was not spared the pain, separation, and need for trust experienced by those who love. Our suffering can be transformed by imitating Christ's love – a love which he learned from his parents. The miracle of Christmas assures us that God boundlessly enriches our everyday lives when lived with love.

NO Children’s Liturgy meeting. These will resume on Sunday, January 5 at the 10.30 am Mass.
The Lord’s Flock prayer group is also not meeting this weekend; they will meet again next Sunday at the regular time.

NEW YEAR’S DAY – Mary, Mother of God – Wednesday, Jan 01, 2014

Time and again the Old Testament considers the birth of a child, especially a first-born son, to be God’s greatest blessing. But a more pessimistic strain occurs also, for to be human is to know uncertainty, pain and death. None can avoid this law. In his letter to the Galatians this is Paul’s starting point. God’s Son, a Jew born of Mary, knew the subjection of human life even to undergoing his people’s custom of circumcision. His perfect acceptance of human life has filled it with glorious possibilities. Before we were slaves; now in the name of Jesus and through his Spirit we can call God Father. But what have these readings to do with Mary, mother of God? From the fifth century, January 1, was celebrated in Rome as her feast. The mother of this child must be remembered with him. Mary’s assent to God’s plan marks the new age of humanity allowing us to pass from slavery to the freedom of God’s children. How blessed were we when God chose Mary to be the mother of his Son!



First Friday of the month – Friday, Jan 03

The regular **Frist Friday** devotions start at 12.15 pm and include prayers, Divine Mercy chaplet and holy Mass. Silent adoration of the Most Blessed Sacrament proceeds through the afternoon and early evening. Prayers, devotions and Benediction begin at 6.30 pm and holy Mass conclude the day’s devotion.

Sunday of the Epiphany of the Lord – Sunday, Jan 05

The feast of the **EPIPHANY OF THE LORD** is the last of the major Christmas celebrations. Next Sunday’s feast of the *Baptism of the Lord* concludes the season. The regular schedule for Sunday Masses is followed and there will be **no Children’s Liturgy** today. The Lord’s Flock prayer meeting is at 2.00 pm.

Feast of the Infant Jesus – Jan 08

A Holy Hour of prayer, meditation and adoration of the Most Blessed Eucharist starts at 6.00 pm. The Rosary will be recited and benediction concludes the prayer hour. The festive Mass starts at 7.00 pm. All are welcome especially the Secular Carmelites and their friends.



First Holy Communion & Confirmation classes – 2014

We remind parents, students and candidates registered in our parish’s classes for 2014 that these start meeting next weekend. Friday, Jan 10 at 6.30 pm we have a parents meeting in our church hall for First Holy Communion applicants. Classes are on Sunday at 9.30 to 10.15 am for FHC applicants (in public schools) and at the 10.30 am Mass for all others.

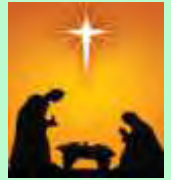
