




19th SUN IN ORDINARY TIME - B

Jesus' offer of the Eucharist requires us to accept or reject him as Lord of our lives. God's greatest gifts surpass our human understanding; we must trust God completely or refuse the gift. How difficult it was for Jesus' contemporaries, who know of his origins, to accept his claim to be the bread from heaven! Jesus responded to their complaints by a greater gift, offering himself for the world's salvation. As sacramental sign to unite us with that offering he left the Eucharist. Do we accept it as necessary for our eternal life? If we do, Jesus says, it is not because of our own merits. The Father teaches us and leads us to the Son. The manna in the desert pre-figures Christ, our true bread; the first reading gives another figure of the Eucharist. When Elijah was discouraged and wanted to die, God fed him so that he might reach the holy mountain, as now the Eucharist strengthens us for our momentous journey to God. The letter to the Ephesians urges us to be motivated by Christ's selfless love. Let us remember that Christ's love is made available to us in the sacrament of the Eucharist.

20th SUN IN ORDINARY TIME - B

Today Jesus himself teaches us about the Eucharist. Speaking directly and in concrete terms, he promises the gift of eternal life to those who feed sacramentally on him, giving himself freely for the world's life. The crowd objects to this mystery beyond its comprehension, even as our faith is tested by this difficult word of Jesus. He does not reply with rational arguments, but again insists that we nourish ourselves with the bread he gives. Bread and wine for our eating and drinking are the visible signs of the presence of the living Christ crucified and risen. The Eucharist, given at the Last Supper, is the active presence of the Lord with us, the memorial of his saving death and the promise to us of glory forever. The first reading invites us to abandon our human ways and partake of the banquet prepared by God's wisdom. Ephesians exhorts us to redeem the world we live in by giving continual thanks to God. Our praise reaches highest expression in the Mass, where it is united with Jesus' perfect offering.

Today's Gospel asks for us "How can this man give us His flesh to eat?" Through the mystery of Eucharistic consecration we partake of the "living bread". Rev. Deacon Patrick Matthews


Deacon Pat Matthews is a married man, With family and friends, living God's plan, A full time job for income and need; strict and sincere example to lead.
