

10th SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME- B

Since man and woman succumbed to temptation, human life has been deeply affected by sin. But God promised to send someone who would vanquish the tempter. Today’s gospel



presents Jesus as the promised victor over Satan. The crowds recognize their liberator, although his relatives are sceptical and the learned men of Jerusalem even ascribed his powers to Satan. To clear himself of their charge, Jesus gives two examples. Internal dissensions, whether in governments or families, end in the collapse of the institution. Satan would not use his own power to liberate the enslaved from his rule! Then Jesus compares himself to a burglar who takes a strong man by surprise; he is stronger than Satan. Solemnly Jesus warns that we must not reject the Holy Spirit, thereby refusing forgiveness. Most striking is Jesus’ insistence that we are related to him when we listen to his word and go God’s will; blood ties are irrelevant. As Christ was victorious so will we be, St. Paul says Our Christian optimism is test of our faith in Christ’s victory.

Save Summer Jobs & Reach Out to Your Member of Parliament

Is it fair that Canadians must agree with the government to be eligible to participate in a federal program? Groups applying for the 2018 Canada Summer Jobs grant were required to indicate their agreement with certain beliefs held by the current federal government. This contravenes the *Canadian Charter of Rights and Freedoms*, which guarantees the freedom of religion and conscience, of thought, belief, opinion and expression, as well as “equal protection and equal benefit of the law without discrimination.” Dozens of Catholic organizations throughout the Archdiocese of Toronto were impacted by this policy.
