THE MOST HOLY BODY & BLOOD OF CHRIST- B


The Eucharistic Celebration is the Christian Passover. Jesus is our Passover lamb and we are liberated from our sins. His blood, offered for us in sacrifice, makes us clean and renews the



covenant God made with us long ago. Jesus gives a new interpretation to a traditional ritual meal, breaking break and sharing the cup as sacramental sign of the total gift of himself, which he offers on the cross for all people. In the first reading, we see how the people sanctify their acceptance of God's covenant, his promise to them. They submit to God, the creator of all things, by offering sacrifice; their common sharing of the offerings by eating of them establishes their unity. Moses sprinkles blood on them to signify that they are forgiven, healed, and made holy. But the sacrifices of the old covenant, the letter to the Hebrews tells us. were only outward signs of repentance. Jesus' perfect self-offering has the power to transform us inwardly. We can look forward to the fulfillment of God's promise, when we will drink the new wine with our savior in God's kingdom.

Continuing his catechesis on liturgy, Pope Francis said that Mass is a memorial of Christ's Passover from death to life, which inspires faithful to bear witness and like the martyrs, freely give themselves to others. Francis explained that he used the term "memorial" in a biblical sense, meaning that Mass is more a than a remembrance because it makes the
